FROM THE OFFG. DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, BENGAL,

TO ALL INSPECTORS OF SCHOOLS, INCLUDING JOINT INSPECTOR OF ORISSA,
PRINCIPALS OF COLLEGES, AND VICE-PRESIDENTS OF DISTRICT COMMITTEES OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

SIR,

THE Comptroller of Indian Treasuries having informed me that the Bank of Bengal, which hold Government Securities for Rs. 2,100 of the 4 per cent. loan of 1854-55 on account of the Pollock Medal Prize Fund, cannot give any more information on the subject than that those notes on account of the Pollock Medal Prize Fund were made over to them by the Sub-Treasurer in February 1862 along with other securities, I have the honour to request that you will be so good as to state, after due search of the records of your office, whether you can find any trace of the Fund, and the circumstances under which the notes referred to above were made over to the Bank of Bengal.
