THE Resolution of the Public Works Department of this Government, No. 16, dated the 2nd January 1875, limits the work which may legitimately be done by civil officers to buildings on the books of the Public Works Department, from the grant for petty construction and repairs, to *repairs*. The orders contained in this Resolution have been disregarded in one instance by the civil officer carrying out on his own responsibility, and without reference to the Public Works Department, a work which was not properly classifiable as repairs from his grant for petty construction and repairs. As it is essentially necessary that the procedure laid down should be strictly adhered to, I am to request that you will be good enough to remind all the officers subordinate to you that they must limit themselves to carrying out repairs, and not undertake constructions, however petty.

3. The indents must be sent in triplicate, a fourth copy being retained by the indenting officer for record in his own office.

4. The heading of the indents showing the period for which the forms are to last, with directions for transmission, and the columns giving (1) the balance on the date of last indent; (2) the number received during the year; (3) the consumption of the last twelve months, and (4) the number in hand on date of indent, must be carefully and accurately filled up. Where this is impossible, an explanation will be entered.

6. The indents should be for a full supply of all the forms contained in the printed list of each department estimated to last for a whole year, as in column 3 of the list, and not more than one indent must be submitted from each office for any one class of forms. Separate indents for the same forms from the several departments under one officer are expressly forbidden by the Board of Revenue.
