That I did not attend the college even on Friday, the 18th Inst., on which day, as I heard afterwards, Mr. Jackson made a boy of the Fourth Year Class stand up.

That I am quite innocent and can have no hand in the matter, as I was ill, and did not attend the college on the above-mentioned days.

Under these circumstances, I hope that
you would kindly consider my case, and exempt
me from being fined.
