

The leave applied for is admissible and it is recommended.



Notice to the Members of the Governing Body.

The post of an assistant Librarian fell vacant on the retirement of Maulvi Syed Ali Akhtar. The D.P.I. directed that the post is to be filled by a non-Muslim candidate not belonging to the Scheduled Caste, after advertisement. Accordingly the post was advertised and altogether 29 applications were received from non-Muslim non-Scheduled Caste candidates who had passed the Intermediate Examination which is the minimum qualification for this post. Of the applicants only 5 have any training in Librarianship. Two of them are employed in the Education Department of the Government of Bengal; two are employed in the Imperial Library, (one in a temporary leave vacancy) and the remaining candidate has no practical experience of work in a Library. Of the two candidates who are working in the Education Department one Babu Manujendra Kumar Roy, is an Assistant Clerk in the Bengal Sanskrit Association, though he passed the Examination in Librarianship. His application has been forwarded by the Secretary of the Bengal Sanskrit Association without any recommendation. He further says that Manujendra Babu even if he is selected will not be released till a suitable substitute is found for him. We need not therefore consider his case.

Babu Kumudindu Bhuson Roy Choudhury who is employed in a ~~five~~ vacancy in the Imperial Library has not applied through the Head of his office. This application also need not therefore be considered.

We also need not consider the application of Babu Ramani Mohan Roy who has no practical experience. This leaves only two candidates:

(1) Babu Prafulla Kumar Ganguly, Assistant Librarian, Sanskrit College and (2) Babu Amarendra Nath Gupta who is working in the Imperial Library. His application has been recommended by the Librarian of the Imperial Library. This gentleman is an M.A. III Class and a Pass Course B.A. of the Calcutta University. Babu Prafulla Kumar Ganguly is a First Class Honoursman of the Calcutta University and read up to the M.A. Degree but gave up his studies when he was appointed under Government.

As Babu Prafulla Kumar Ganguly is already serving in the department and as his case has been commended by the D.P.I. for consideration, along with other applications, I recommend that he should be appointed to the post of the Assistant Librarian.







A note containing proposals which require the approval of the Governing Body, presidency College.

1. Babu Gopal Chandra Mitra, Assistant to the Botanical Laboratory of the College has applied vide his application in original enclosed for earned leave for 5 days from the 20th to 24th February, 1945 and as the leave is certified to be admissible it may be granted. No acting arrangement is proposed for the short period of absence.

2. Babu Nirod Baran Roy off Acting Second Clerk of the College and in the scale of Rs.90-110/- a month and 21 days (vide his application with the medical certificate) for leave on average on medical grounds for a period of a month and 21 days from 1st March, 1945 with permission to affix a portion of the Summer Vacation of the College to commence from the 22nd April, As the leave is certified to be admissible it may be granted and the following acting arrangements made in his place.

PROCEEDINGS.

A meeting of the Governing Body was held on the 10th May, 1945 at 5 p.m. in the Principal's Room.

1. The proceedings of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

2. The Principal reported for the information of the Governing Body that (i) the College had been granted affiliation upto the B.A. Honours standard in Bengali & Urdu with effect from the next session (ii) that, with the approval of Government and through the courtesy of the Head of the Geography Department of the University arrangements had been made for the teaching of 10 students of the College in Geography upto the B.A. & B.Sc. Honours standard at the University, on payment of a lump grant of Rs.1,200/- annually, but that this arrangement was purely a temporary one till provision can be made for teaching Geography upto the Honours standard in the College. (iii) that the Director of Public Instruction had been moved to reduce the tuition fees of Presidency College graduates who will be admitted to the M.A. & M.Sc. classes according to the following scale:

M.A. Classes & M.Sc. Mathematics Class - Rs.11/- a month

M.Sc. Chemistry, Physics & Geology classes - 15/- do

M.Sc. classes in other subjects. - Rs.13/- do

(iv) that the Director of Public Instruction had been addressed to revive the post of the Roll Clerk which had been abolished as an economy measure, (v) that there was a theft in the Baker Laboratory when certain valuable parts of machinery had been stolen from the College workshop and that the Police had been informed and enquiries were proceeding, (vi) that Government had sanctioned the retention of the two temporary posts of accounts clerks for a further period of six months from the 1st March, 1945 and that though both the posts were necessary for efficient work, he was addressing Government for the retention at present of only one post till the end of the financial year, as it is difficult to find a well-qualified man on the pay offered for the post at present (vii) that the special audit of the College accounts had been completed and a report was awaited, (viii) that he had been informed that the Eden Hindu Hostel buildings would be returned to the College by the A.R.P. authorities by the end of July, it was hoped.

3. The Principal stated that he would put up before the Governing Body a scheme for the extension of the Baker Laboratory buildings to provide for an expansion of the Geology Department. He also represented that the acquisition of a plot of land near the northern boundary of the College grounds was essential for the development of the College.

4. Considered a letter from Mr. R.C. Ghose, Barrister-at-law offering to place 3½ % Government securities of the face value of Rs.1,500/- for the creation of a Trust Fund in memory of his father the late Sir Charu Chander Ghose, a distinguished alumnus of the College for the annual award of a book prize of

Rs. 50/- annually to the best student of the Honours English class.  
 RESOLVED that the thanks of the Governing Body should be conveyed to Mr. Ghosh and the Trust Fund be created on the same terms as the other Trust Funds in the College.

5. Considered a proposal of the Geology Department for the creation of the post of three bearers to cope with the additional work of the Department.

RESOLVED that the Principal be requested to address the Director of Public Instruction with relevant facts and figures for the creation of three additional posts of bearers for the Geology Department.

6. Considered a proposal from the Head of the Physics Department for the appointment of three trained bearers to be attached to the I.Sc., B.Sc. and the M.Sc. Laboratories in place of the existing provision of an instrument keeper for all the three laboratories.

After a thorough discussion, it was unanimously agreed that the needs of the Laboratories would be much better served if there were 2 posts of instrument keepers, one for the I.Sc. and one for the B.Sc. Laboratories and 2 student-assistantships were created for the M.Sc. Laboratories. The student-assistants would be allowed the privilege of free tuition.

RESOLVED that the Principal be requested to address the Director of Public Instruction for the creation of an additional post of instrument keeper and two student-assistantships, carrying the privilege of free tuition, for the Physics Laboratories.

Considered the question of increasing the present allotment for excursions for the science departments.

RESOLVED that the Principal be requested to enquire further into the specific needs of the different science departments and address the Director of Public Instruction if an increased provision is considered necessary.

RESOLVED that the surplus balance of the Trust Funds as in the annexed sheet be invested in 3½% Government paper and added to the corpus of the Funds.

RESOLVED that the revised rules regarding the admission of and fees chargeable from Unsuccessful and Casual students as drawn up by the Principal be approved.

RESOLVED that Babu Birendranath Roy Chaudhury be confirmed in his post as Assistant Accountant with effect from 17th May, 1945.

11. RESOLVED that Babu Birendra Nath Ghose, Professor of Statistics and Babu Purna Chandra Mukherjee of the Indian Statistical Institute be appointed Honorary Lecturers in the Physics Department.

12. RESOLVED that earned leave for 9 days with effect from the 9th March, 1945 be granted to Mr. Sahidulla, Asstt. Mechanic, Physics Department.

13. RESOLVED that leave on average pay for a period of 13 days from 25th June, 1945 with permission to prefix the summer vacation of the College and to affix Sunday, the 8th July, 1945, be granted to Babu Surendranath Das, Assistant in the Astronomical Laboratory.

14. RESOLVED that leave on average pay for 13 days from the 7th April, 1945 with permission to affix the summer vacation of the College commencing on 20th April, 1945, be granted to Babu Saroj Ranjan Ghose, Laboratory Assistant Chemistry Department.

15. RESOLVED that Maulvi Mujibar Rahman be allowed to continue to act as Assistant Librarian vice Babu Ramesh Chandra Nandy on deputation as Cashier.

1. The Secretary placed on the table the proceedings of the last meeting and of the notes approved in circulation.

2. The Secretary reported that the Eden Hindu Hostel Buildings were restored to the College by the A.H.P. authorities on the 1st October, 1945 and that the Hostel had been functioning from that date.

3. The Secretary reported that the Special Audit Report on the Accounts of the Presidency College had been received and was being considered by the College Office to meet the objections raised therein.

The Secretary further reported that he had examined the case in detail and was of opinion that no mis-appropriation had taken place although there was negligent work in the Accounts Section.

Order - Recorded.

Mr. P. C. Chaudhuri (Accountant General, Bengal) in his capacity as a member of the Governing Body, kindly suggested that the papers might be sent to him for examination. The Secretary agreed to this.

4. The following leave cases and acting arrangements were sanctioned :-

(i) Out of 12 days leave from 3rd December to 15th December, 1945, previously granted to Babu Surendra Nath Das, Assistant Astronomical Observatory, in the scale of Rs. 125-5-250, leave for 7 days viz., 9th to 15th December, 1945, was cancelled. He was permitted to return to duty to his post on the 10th December, 1945 and to affix Sunday, the 9th December, 1945 to his leave.

(ii) Maulvi Md. Ismail Hossain, Assistant Librarian, in the scale of Rs. 40-100 was appointed to act as Librarian in the scale of Rs. 125-200 with effect from 10th December, 1945 viz. Maulvi Abdul Zamil Khan granted leave from 10th to 24th December, 1945.

Proceedings of the meeting of the Governing Body of the Presidency College, Calcutta, held in the Principal's room at 5 p.m. on Tuesday, the 18th December, 1945.

Present:

1. The Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rupendra Coomar Mitra, M.Sc., M.L. - Vice President (in the Chair)
2. The Hon'ble Mr. Justice N.A. Khundkar, M.A., Bar-at-Law.
3. Mr. P. C. Choudhury, M.A., C.I.E., Accountant General, Bengal.
4. Mr. S. M. Kerawala, M.A. (Cantab), Prof. Presidency College.
5. Dr. N. K. Sen, M.A., D.Sc., Prof. Presidency College.

The Secretary informed the members that the President, Lt. Col. Sir Hasan Suhrawardy, had regretted his inability to attend the meeting on account of an urgent private business. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President, The Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rupendra Coomar Mitra, took the chair.

1. The Secretary placed on the table the proceedings of the last meeting and of the notes approved in circulation.

Order - confirmed.

2. The Secretary reported that the Eden Hindu Hostel Buildings were restored to the College by the A.H.P. authorities on the 1st October, 1945 and that the Hostel had been functioning from that date.

Order - Recorded.

3. The Secretary reported that the Special Audit Report on the Accounts of the Presidency College had been received and was being considered by the College Office to meet the objections raised there in.

The Secretary further reported that he had examined the case in detail and was of opinion that no mis-appropriation had taken place although there was negligent work in the Accounts Section.

Order - Recorded.

4. Mr. P. C. Chaudhuri (Accountant General, Bengal) in his capacity as a member of the Governing Body, kindly suggested that the papers might be sent to him for examination. The Secretary agreed to this.

4. The following leave cases and acting arrangements were sanctioned :-

(i) Out of 13 days leave from 3rd December to 15th December, 1945, previously granted to Babu Surendra Nath Das, Assistant Astronomical Observatory, in the scale of Rs. 125-5-250, leave for 7 days viz., 9th to 15th December, 1945, was cancelled. He was permitted to return to duty on the 10th December, 1945 and to affix Sunday, the 9th December, 1945 to his leave.

(ii) Maulvi Md. Ismail Bossain, Assistant Librarian, in the scale of Rs. 40-100 was appointed to act as Librarian in the scale of Rs. 125-200 with effect from 10th December, 1945 viz. Maulvi Aboul Zamil Khan granted leave from 10th to 24th December, 1945.

(iii) Babu Radhika Prasad Dhar, Assistant, Physiology Department, in the scale of Rs. 50-130 was granted leave on private affairs for 4 days, viz. 3rd to 7th December, 1945 with permission to prefix Sunday, the 2nd December, 1945 to his leave, in terms of Rule 172(b) of the B.S. Rules Part I.

(iv) Babu Jagadish Chandra Bhattacharyya, Acting Instrument Keeper, Physics Department, in the scale of Rs. 40-60 was granted extra-ordinary leave for 13 days, viz. 3rd to 15th December, 1945, with permission to prefix Sunday, the 2nd December, 1945 and affix Sunday, the 16th December, 1945 to his leave, in terms of Rule 174 (2) of the B.S. Rules, Part I.

(v) The Secretary placed on table the College Holiday list for 1946.

Order - the list as drawn up by the Secretary (vide appendix) was approved.

(vi) The Secretary placed on the table Government Order No. 1096-Edn., dated 26th November, 1945, sanctioning the retention of the two temporary posts of clerks for the Accounts work of the Presidency College, upto the end of February, 1946, and reported for information and approval of the Governing Body the appointments made against the posts in anticipation.

Order - (i) Babu Benoyendra Chakravary, B.A., who has been acting in one of the temporary posts since 3rd October, 1944, (vide D.P.I.'s Memo. No. 4124-A, dated 11.11.44), be allowed to continue in that appointment, until further orders.

(ii) In the other temporary post, Babu Samarendra Nath Das who has completed the B.Com. course and has a fairly good experience in Accounts work, be appointed to act with effect from 7th December, 1945, until further orders.

In this connexion it was further decided that Government should be moved for the retention of these two posts on a permanent basis in the interest of the accounts work of the college.

(vii) The question of the revival of the post of the Dean of the College was discussed at length. The unanimous opinion of the Governing Body was that the post of the Dean should be revised immediately. In fact it was considered desirable that not merely one such post but two additional posts of Assistant Deans should also be created. The Secretary was requested to address Government in this matter.

8. The Secretary placed on the table a note from the Head of the Chemistry Department (Dr. M. Quadrat-i-Khuda) recommending that Mr. Manindra Nath Mitra, M.Sc., recently appointed temporary assistant in the Chemistry Department in the scale of Rs. 50-130/- be given an initial pay of Rs. 100/-.

The Governing Body strongly supported the proposal and requested the Secretary to write to Government accordingly.

9. The Secretary placed on the table the case of Namdhari Ram, a skilled bearer in the Physics Department in the scale of Rs. 20-30 in the inferior service for confirmation as an Electrician in that Dept. on Rs. 30 (fixed) in superior service.

Resolved - That the Secretary be requested to take such action as may be considered proper in consultation with Mr. P.C. Chaudhuri in his capacity as a member of the Governing Body.

10. The Secretary reported that no large non-recurring grants for the improvement of the equipments of the Science Departments had been sanctioned during the last 25 years. He proposed writing to Government asking for an interim grant of at least ~~xx~~ 2 lakhs of rupees for immediate requirements of the Science Departments. He has also started preparing comprehensive proposals for the long range planning of science teaching in the college in future.

The Governing Body approved of the action being taken by the Secretary in this matter.

Sir Rupendra Coomar Mitra moved from the chair:

The governing body places on record its deep sense of sorrow  
at the news of the untimely death of Sir J. N. Mukherjee, President  
of the governing body on the 16th September, 1946. He was for a  
long time associated with the Presidency College and had helped  
it in many ways and he guided the governing body with sober counsel  
since he became president from the session 1944-45.

The resolution was passed with all the members standing  
in silence.

2. The proceedings of the governing body dated 18th December, 1945  
(already circulated) were confirmed.

3. Professor P. C. Mahalanobis placed before the meeting a report  
he had submitted to the government of Bengal on the 21st August, 1946  
in connexion with the recent disturbances. After a thorough  
discussion the following decisions were made :

(1) RESOLVED that the governing body is of opinion that there is  
urgent necessity of taking protective measures for safeguarding  
the college buildings and properties and strongly recommends  
to government that the following arrangements be made

(a) eight armed guards for patrolling the college at night  
by two, and two on duty near the Chemical Laboratory in  
the main building;

(b) a number of flood lights to be fitted in the main  
building, Hare School and other laboratories so as to  
enable the grounds and dark corners being lighted up at  
night when necessary;

(c) boundary walls to be raised and covered by barbed  
wires at the top.

(iii) Also resolved that the principal be requested to contact the authorities of the Calcutta University and Medical College and to explore possibilities of giving better protection to the area in the neighbourhood of the Medical College, Calcutta University and the Presidency College.

4. Considered the following letter No. 39954 dated 10th September 1946 from the Director of Public Instruction, Bengal.

"In continuation of this office Note No. 39954 dated 3rd September 1946 forwarding a copy of the Government order sanctioning the transfer of I.C.S. Mr. Ahmed Ali, professor of English, from the Bengal Senior Educational Service post of professor of the subject (temporarily brought down from the Chittagong College to the Presidency College) to the vacancy caused by the retirement of Mr. Girishwar Banerjee, the principal is hereby informed that as Mr. Ahmed Ali is now the seniormost professor of English in the Bengal Senior Educational Service at the College he will automatically be the Head of the Department of English in the College."

The appointment of Heads of Departments has always been the responsibility of the principal, Presidency College and it has been recognised that the headship has to be decided by the principal on considerations other than seniority in the gradation list (as explicitly stated in D.O. No. 400 dated the 20th March 1946 from the Director of Public Instruction, Bengal).

5. There are many instances of seniormost officers not being made Heads of Departments. A few recent examples are given below:

Philosophy: Mr. A. H. Mukherjee and later Mr. S. K. Das Gupta were Heads of the Philosophy Department and not Mr. P. D. Bhattacharya who was senior to both in the I.C.S. At one time Rai Bahadur Mr. Mitra (in the I.C.S.) was Head instead of Mr. S. K. Das Gupta (in the I.C.S.).

History: professor S. K. Chatterjee (I.C.S.) was Head instead of prof. N. N. Das (acting in I.C.S.). prof. D. M. Mitra (I.C.S.) and Mr. H. Chakrabarti (I.C.S.) became Heads although prof. S. C. Mukherjee was holding a substantive appointment in the I.C.S.

Mathematics: prof. S. P. Das was Head instead of prof. N. M. Sen who was more senior in the I.C.S.

Physics: prof. H. H. Banerjee (I.C.S.) was Head instead of prof. P. C. Mahalanobis (I.C.S.).

6. The above list is not exhaustive but establishes beyond dispute the fact that Heads of Departments were not appointed automatically by seniority. Even in general administration there is no bar against I.C.S. officers serving under officers in other services.

7. The curtailment of the principal's power of appointing Heads of Department would take away from him a large degree of real responsibility and authority and is bound to have a pernicious effect on the internal administration of the College. From the point of view of past practice as well as of sound principle such curtailment would appear to be a reflection on the ability and sense of responsibility of the present incumbent. prof. Mahalanobis stated that it was open to the Director of Education or to any other person interested in the matter to make specific suggestions regarding the appointment of Head of Departments, and that he would give such suggestions his best consideration but he was of opinion that the ultimate decision must be left to the man on the spot.

(ii) INVOLVED that for reasons mentioned in the above the principal is of the opinion that the principal, Presidency College should continue

exercise the power of appointing Heads of departments at his discretion. It would be open to the Director of public instruction or any other person interested in the matter to make specific suggestions regarding the appointment of heads of departments and the principal would give such suggestions his best consideration but the ultimate decision must be made by the man on the spot.

(14) RESOLVED that the secretary to the governing body be requested to write accordingly to the secretary to the Government of Bengal, Education Department.

(15) RESOLVED further that in view of the importance of the principle involved in the present issue, the principal be requested to keep the Governing Body informed and to consult it in dealing with the Directorate or Ministry of Education in this matter.

5. The following leave case and other arrangements were mentioned.

(1) Mr. A. Z. Khan Librarian was granted leave on private affairs for one day viz the 3rd September, 1946.

(2) Mr. Muhammad Palman Choudhury, M.Sc. Lecturer in the Department of Chemistry was appointed as the Superintendent of the Muslim Hostel with effect from 14th September, 1946.

(3) Mr. Abdur Nabi, B.Sc. Laboratory assistant in the Department of Physics was granted an extended period of probation for one year with effect from 13th March, 1946.

Formal orders may be allowed to be issued in their favour as early as the appointment of the lecturers as proposed above is communicated to this office.

Babu Manindranath Mitra M.Sc. however tendered his resignation of the appointment on the 5th instant in as much as he reports to have secured a better appointment elsewhere. The resignation tendered may be accepted. The Director of Public Instruction, Bengal has already been moved to depute a suitable M.Sc. candidate in his place.

4) Babu Bhupendra Nath Mitra retired professor of the Department of Geology of this College has expressed his intention to place at the disposal of the College 34 % Government premiery note of the value of Rs.500/- for the award of a medal to be called Chandranath Mitra Medal in memory of his late father who was an old student of this College. The said offer may be accepted with thanks.

5) The value of certain articles of the Department of Chemistry amounting to Rs.25/- only which were burnt and damaged due to an accidental outbreak of fire may be allowed to be written off.

I came back from Bombay by air on Monday afternoon (Aug. 19) and managed with some difficulty to reach the Presidency College at about 6 p.m. The Eda Hindu Hostel with about 200 inmates was barricaded. I heard a general account of happenings of the last few days from the Hostel Supdt., Prof. S. N. Majumdar and the boys. There were several attacks on the Hostel and attempts to set it on fire which were defeated by day and night vigilance. One house on the west of the College grounds had been set on fire; but the women and children somehow managed to escape and were helped to get refuge in the Cal. University building by our boys. Other families in the neighbourhood were also helped in the same way. A large number of persons had also been given shelter in the Hostel itself and were still living there. Food position was difficult but not acute. Additional supplies had been secured on Monday morning. Electricity, water supply and flushing arrangements were in working order.

The Supdt., and the boys were evidently in a state of tension and were apprehending attacks from the North-west corner of the College grounds which touches a number of Muslim houses in contact with the Kalabagan Bustee. I was told that raids and attacks had mostly originated from this quarter. I must mention here that the North-west portion of the College grounds has been a plague spot for a long time. In the past on many occasions hooligans and ruffians scaled the boundary wall on the north or the west and entered the college ground. During the short time of my principalship of about a year I had occasion to report more than once of theft and burglary in the college buildings facing this corner and also two cases of fire in the north-west portion of the college ground both of which were caused by hooligans in this neighbourhood.

I am told by the Hostel Superintendent and the boys that persons were often seen sitting on the boundary wall, and on at least one occasion on Saturday I am informed a large number of persons were observed to come down into the college ground but were chased back by college bearers. On Monday night I slept in the Hindu Hostel. The boys maintained a continuous watch from the Hostel from where the whole of the north-west portion of the college ground can be clearly seen. On more than one occasion shadowy figures near and on the walls were pointed out to me. Except for occasional shoutings there was however no disturbance on Monday night 19/20 August.

I spent the whole of Tuesday in the Presidency College and had my meals in the Hostel. In the evening when I was sitting in the Hostel Library talking with some of the boys some one came to the window from outside and spoke to some of the boys stating that news had been received of arrangements being made in the north-west corner (near Kalabagan Bustee) for a raid on the College, the Hostel, and Calcutta University Building, during the night. In view of the disturbed condition and also of the fact that the College Laboratories contained much valuable apparatus and stores I decided to sleep in the Principal's room in the south-east corner of the first floor of the main building. At about 8-30 p.m. I went there and found that about 50 college bearers, peons, gardeners etc. had collected with about 10 women folks. All along the bearers had guarded the buildings by themselves, small groups staying at night in the Hare School and the Baker Building with the major portion in the main building.

I went to bed at about 10 p.m. on Tuesday night (20/21 August) but was awakened by loud cries and shouts at about quarter to eleven. On coming out of the south verandah I heard shouts of 'Allah ho Akbar', 'Jai Hind' and 'Vande Mataram'. I walked round and asked our men to remain quiet. They told me that they had seen people near and on the boundary walls in the north-west and had also heard shouts of incitement to attack and great commotion near Pulin Babu's house adjoining the college compound. A military car was patrolling in the College Street. Things quietened down after a little while and again I went to bed.

A little later, at about 20-10 a.m. (20/21 August) I got up on hearing loud shouts. Basanta, a night watchman, came running into the Principal's room and reported that he had seen a big man carrying some kind of weapon in near the Chemistry Honours shed within the College quadrangle, a little to the east of the ARTS LIBRARY. Basanta came running to inform Baban Singh, another night watchman, and saw two other persons in the College ground near the Astronomical Observatory to the west of the ARTS LIBRARY.

Just about that time a military car had come to the college gate. I went down and opened the gate and spoke to the officer-in-charge, Mr. Woodroffe, who had requested the gate to be opened and had asked me to come down as there were loud cries and shoutings in the neighbourhood.

some refugee camp, and spoke to our men to inform the Marwari Relief Society. I understand that the family was removed a little later.

I have been practically without telephone connection since Monday and in the general break down I have not been able to communicate with the Secretariat. I typed myself the earlier portion of this note, but Saral Babu (my steno) having come I am now arranging to send this report typed by him. While dictating, Mr. D. N. Bhattacharyya of 3, Bhawani Dutt Lane and Mr. Hasnad of 7, Bhawani Dutt Lane came to see me at about 12 noon and informed me that they were working on behalf of a joint Hindu-Muslim Peace Committee (United Peace Committee) which had been formed recently. They requested me that I should stop slogans being shouted by the College bearers to which I readily agreed. I have assured them of my full co-operation in their efforts. It is a pity that they did not know of my presence in the college yesterday and also that they did not contact the Hostel Superintendent.

Both Mr. Bhattacharyya and Mr. Hasnad suggested that a Military or some kind of picket should be posted at the north-west corner of the college compound. I strongly support this recommendation. As a matter of fact in my diary written last night I had noted that a picket must be posted here.

I must note here that much valuable apparatus, stores and books are housed in the college buildings which it would be impossible to replace. There is a great deal of Government records in the Statistical Laboratory. The Chemistry Department also is extremely vulnerable to fire.

No officer except myself has been on duty in the college building or compound so far. From what I have seen on Monday and Tuesday nights, and in view of the prevailing state of tension in the neighbourhood, I have no hesitation in requesting Government to place suitable Military or Police Picket in the north west corner of the College for the protection of College Building and property and also the Statistical Laboratory. I should also request arrangements being made, if possible, telephonic communication being maintained with No. B.B.875 in the main building and B.B.1422 in the Science Laboratory.

At about 02-00 I was again called down by Woodroffe. He enquired about the licence of the gun, and I sent for Pulin Babu, who appears to be an employee of the Geological Survey. He mentioned the collecting of spears and swords in the corner adjoining his house. At my suggestion Woodroffe with one or two of his men together with two young men - relations of the Geological Survey employee - went to the north-west portion of the College ground. Two shots were fired as they found a ~~numerous~~ crowd as Woodroffe told me on coming back.

Woodroffe and the military car then withdrew from College grounds. It was arranged that our men should keep watch. If the gang scaled the college wall and came into the compound we would open the main gate and shout for the military car which would ~~at~~ drive straight into the college grounds. I gave detailed instructions to our men. They must keep watch and inform me if anybody came in the college compound. They must not shout and they must wait until I gave them the order to call for the military. The decision must be made by me and not by them whether we should call for military help. I finished the note at 02-33 and went to bed.


I was called up again 03-20 by two Police Inspectors, one Sergeant and Mr. Woodroffe. One Inspector enquired how Pulin Babu came to be within the college compound. I briefly explained and told them that I had a short note written out which they could see. They said they would see in the morning (which they have not done upto Wednesday 12-50 afternoon which appears to be rather surprising). I then retired. The Inspectors asked Pulin Babu what had happened and were making enquiries when I came away. I finished writing notes at 03-40.

Nothing further happened after this. Early in the morning I was awakened by the same young woman who had spoken about her babies. She told me that Pulin Babu had been arrested by the Police and I must do something. I told her that I could not possibly do anything then and she must wait. She was apt to be hysterical, and I had to be rather curt in sending her away.

I got up about 9 o'clock and found the young man who had given us information about Pulin Babu waiting for me. He asked me to arrange for Pulin Babu's bail. I told him that was none of my business. He then asked me to arrange for food etc. for the women and children. I asked him to take his family away to

While I was coming down some of the bearers told me that some women had fled from Pulin Babu's house and were being given shelter in the College. I asked them to bring the refugees to the first floor. While talking to Woodroffe, a young man, (who I believe, is a brother or relation of Pulin Babu) came to meet us at the college gate saying that Pulin Babu and his children were in great danger. He was evidently in a state of great fright and almost on the point of collapsing. I briefly explained the general positions to Woodroffe and told him personally that my impression was that the situation was greatly a matter of strained nerves. However in view of the fact that women had actually taken refuge and a young man was imploring us to help his relations I suggested to Woodroffe to go through the college grounds and enquire. He asked the young man to show the way and went in the military car leaving two pickets near the college gate to maintain contact. I stayed with them and asked all our men to remain absolutely quiet. While the Military car was in the college ground I went upstairs as I heard the women refugees were in a very bad condition. One young woman came out of the room and asked me to rescue her father and other relations and also two babies. She was evidently in practically a hysterical fit. While coming down the stairs I heard two or three rounds of fire, evidently from the military car. Just at this time Pulin Babu and a few others came to the main building to take shelter. The military car had also come back to the college gate and Mr. Woodroffe stated that he had to fire three rounds in order to get Pulin Babu and others away. I then spoke to Woodroffe about the babies and I went round with Woodroffe to the Hare School and Baker buildings but they were not there. It later appeared that they had been deposited with the Military pickets and they were brought back safely in a Military car quite cheerful and smiling. Pulin Babu stated that a gang had attacked his house. He also told me that he had handed over his gun to the officer-in-charge of the military car. From the college building I could see a great deal of commotion and shouting near Pulin Babu's house, and from what Woodroffe told me I think they had to fire out of sheer necessity.

Things quietened down and I sent Pulin Babu and his family to the first floor. I then arranged with Woodroffe to close the college gate, and to shout for them in case there was further trouble and also to sound the college gong. I came back to my room at 01-05, and noted down briefly what had happened. Went to bed at 01-20.

In support of my proposal I may mention that I found practical classes being conducted in more than one shift in high grade universities and institutions in America. It will be obviously desirable to adopt the same policy in India in view of the acute shortage of houses and equipment.

My present proposals involve a recurring expenditure of Rs. 18,705 (inclusive of all allowances during the next 16 months), a non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 10,000/- or a total expenditure of Rs. 18,705/- for which we can immediately provide facilities for training four or five additional students, i.e. by in each of the two post-graduate classes during the next academic sessions. I may mention here that the cost of sending one single student abroad for training in Geology will be considerably more than the total amount involved in my proposal.

I have satisfied myself that these are minimum requirements. I must emphasise that my present proposals are being made without prejudice to other requests for grants already submitted. They are merely intended to tide over the existing emergent situation.

I am aware that the Province of West Bengal is passing through serious financial difficulties, but I hope that it will be possible to sanction the small additional grant for which I am now applying. In case however this is not feasible, I feel I have a special responsibility as I am myself a humble worker in the field of science, and that I should try to do whatever may be really possible for me. I shall be obliged, therefore, if you kindly permit me to issue an appeal to our industrialists and general public for donations to enable us to expand our facilities in Geology which are indispensable for the trial development of the country.

In view of the urgency of this matter, I beg to request you to let me know your decision at a very early date.

Sir,

I have the honour to apply for certain emergency grants for the Geology Department of the Presidency College for reasons given below:-

2. Geology is a subject of vital importance for national development. Presidency College is the only institution in the place in which this subject is taught, and even here present facilities are adequate to admit only 6 students in each of the 5th and 6th year post-graduate classes. Owing to heavy pressure of applications, we however admitted 10 students in the Year class in 1946-47 and have admitted 10 students in the class this year. I find there are still several candidates secured Honours in Geology in the B.Sc. examination but cannot be admitted for lack of accommodation.

3. That there is urgent need of expanding training facilities in Geology has been recognised for a long time, and application for an equipment grant of Rs.30,400/- was submitted vide this office No.1442, dated the 22nd May, 1947 Rs.5,000/- vide this office No.2281, dated 16th September, 1947 and Rs.23,200/- vide this office No.3334, dated 22nd December 1947 but no action has been taken by Government in the matter so far.

4. It will be most deplorable if we cannot provide post-graduate teaching at least for these candidates who have already taken their B.Sc. degree with Honours in Geology. I have discussed the matter in detail with the Head of the Department. We can easily admit upto 20 students in each of the post-graduate classes. The difficulty lies in arranging practical classes, and a comprehensive scheme has been already submitted. Without prejudice to this scheme, I find, however, that we can admit four more students (that is, fourteen together) in the 5th year class by working practical classes in double shifts (involving 22 additional man-hours of work per week in each of the 5th and 6th year classes). Some additional equipment is also indispensable for which a non-recurring grant of Rs.10,000/- will be necessary.

In order to avoid any loss of time, I have given instructions to admit the four qualified candidates (with the Honours degree in Geology) to the 5th year theoretical classes. The Head of the Geology Department has also kindly agreed to allow them to do such portions of the practical work as may be feasible with the available resources, but these students have been informed that adequate arrangements cannot be made for practical classes and unless and until necessary funds become available.

5. In order to give necessary facilities for practical work to the 14 students now being admitted in the 5th year classes, I propose running the practical classes in double shifts and request immediate sanction of one teacher in the S.E.S. (Rs.125-25/2-150-20/2-250-15/2-265-(e.b.)-15/2-310-20/2-350) one Laboratory Assistant (Rs.75-5/2-115-5/2-125-(e.b.)-5/2-135-10/2-17) and one bearer (Rs.13-1/5-17) and another teacher in the S.E.S. (Rs.125-350) with effect from July, 1948 when additional practical work will have to be arranged for an increased number of students in the 5th year class also.

6. I further request that a non-recurring grant of Rs.10,000 be immediately sanctioned for the purchase of the following apparatus



The Hon'ble Mr. Justice R. C. Mitra, President of the Governing Body, in the Chair; The Hon'ble Mr. Justice K. C. Das Gupta; Mr. Gopiballav Mandal; Prof. S. B. Samal, Teachers' Representative; Dr. J. C. Sen Gupta, Principal and ex-officio member of the Governing Body; Prof. G. D. Bhar, Bursar and ex-officio member of the Governing Body.

Dr. S. C. Sen Gupta, Head of the Department of English, was invited by special invitation, in connection with item No. 10.

1. The proceedings of the last meeting held on 26. 11. 50 were read and confirmed.
2. Matters disposed of by circulation on 3. 3. 50, 4. 4. 50, 21. 12. 50, and 28. 3. 51 were formally approved.
3. D. P. I., West Bengal's Memo. No. 118(3)-A, dated 5. 1. 51, concerning the sanction of remuneration to certain members of the staff for extra-work in connection with the Secretariat Clerkship Examination, was placed before the meeting and formal sanction was accorded by the Governing Body.
4. Four lists of Library books found missing in stock during the years 1948, 1949 and 1950 were placed on the table for being scrutinized. The meeting desired that the Librarian should further scrutinize the lists to determine how the books came to be ~~lost~~ missing and directed him to submit a formal report to be placed at the next meeting of the Governing Body.



After discussion on above it was resolved that the scheme of a School of Economics should get preference and a suitable structure should be built immediately for the purpose. It was decided that the western portion of the proposed Arts Block should be built into a four storeyed structure to provide the required space of 11,300 Sq.ft. The complete Arts Block may be raised after the Chemistry Laboratory is shifted into its proposed new Chemistry and Science Library Block.

When the Arts Block is completed the distribution of space among the School of Economics and the other Arts Departments and Gymnasium may be as proposed in the sketch of the structure.

The Principle of providing about 12' x 16' separate rooms for each two teachers, 15 such rooms for the 30 Arts teachers and 10 rooms for the Senior Professors, was discussed and accepted.

It was agreed after discussion that the Chemistry and Science Library Block and other Sciences Block be built as proposed in the plan, and that the Assembly Hall Block should be built between the Main Building and the Baker Laboratory to the east of the existing football ground.

The President suggested that the probability of acquiring land to the North of the College compound, chiefly to the North of the present Astronomy Block, be explored and attempts made to acquire some land.

It was resolved finally that the erection of the different buildings be phased as below :-

Relevant extract from the proceedings of the meeting of the Governing Body held on the 21st April, 1953 at 4.30 P.M.

\* 6. The proposal for the School of Economics circulated was discussed.

Received that the School of Economics should be started with the least possible delay.

Received further that the Scheme of starting a School of Economics be redrafted in consultation with Dr. J.C.Ghosh (This is in progress and will be forwarded as soon as it is completed)\*.

The scheme was modified in the line suggested by Dr.J.C.Ghosh and sent to him. The Principal and the Head of the Department of Economics of the College are of opinion that the School should be called Graduate School of Economics attached to Presidency College and that the School should not have a separate identity from the College. This was communicated to Dr.J.C.Ghosh and a copy of the letter of the Head of the Department of Economics is enclosed herewith.

There was next a discussion between Dr.J.C.Ghosh and Principal, and the Head of the Department of Economics of Presidency College on the 29th June at 3 P.M.

Dr. J.C.Ghosh did not agree to the proposal and was of opinion that

- (i) That the School should have a separate identity and call Calcutta School of Economics.
- (ii) It should be under a Dean specially appointed with a special Grade of salary who should also be the Head of the Department of Economics of the College.
- (iii) It should be under a separate Governing Body of which Principal, Presidency College will be the ex-officio Vice-President.

The College is of opinion that the School of Economics visualised by Dr. J.C.Ghosh should come under the University, the scheme presented is concerned with the improvement of facilities of study and research in Economics in the Presidency College.

2. Purchase of the apparatus and chemicals,etc. for the Science Departments as per detailed list enclosed may be approved at prices quoted against each item. Tenders have been taken in respect of the items and lowest tenders accepted. The expenditure can be met from the available sanctioned contingent grant.

3. To fill up the vacant post of Assistant Electrician, Chemistry Department, in the scale of Rs.30-1-36-2-45, the vacancy was duly advertised. The Principal.

Please refer to your query of the 30th April, 1953 in regard to the proposed School of Economics attached to this College.

I and my colleagues do not support the idea that (i) the School should be called Calcutta School of Economics instead of Graduate School as proposed in the draft; and (ii) the School should have a separate identity from the College. The reasons are as follows.

First as to the second point mentioned above. The proposed School is intended to function not only as a high level research centre but also as a teaching institution under the University. In addition to pursuing the work of research, it will have to undertake the teaching of students in undergraduate (and also Post-graduate) courses in Economics. It follows that the School will (i) absorb the present teaching staff of the Economics Department and the Department will thereby cease to exist; and (ii) control the general body of students who read for the B.A. Hons. and Pass courses in Economics and, perhaps, for some time to come, I.A. Civics students. It will appear that such an arrangement will create new problems in administration between the College and the School. Students of Economics who, evidently, will be under the control of the School authorities in respect of their honours subject will also be under the control of the Principal of the College in the matter of their Pass subjects. In similar manner students who offer Economics as one of their Pass subjects and students of Civics in the I.A. course will be subjected to dual control. The teachers of the School may have also to serve different masters. To avoid such difficulties and to ensure a smooth working of the School we have viewed it as a natural and to some extent, a gradual extension of the Economics Department of the College.

In regard to point No.(i) under reference, it is precisely because the name 'Calcutta' associated with the School will suggest a separate identity of the institution that it has not been preferred in the Department.

Shri Hiralal Das, former Assistant Librarian of the Arts Library, Presidency College left on transfer in February, 1954 and his salary with allowances for one month amounting to Rs.138/4/- was held up pending complete stock-taking during the Summer Vacation of his section of the Arts Library.

The stock-taking was carried out and as a result 107 books were found missing and unaccounted for. Many of the books were badly worn out through constant use and the price comes to Rs.198-1-6(approximately).

Professor-in-charge of the Arts Library in recommending writing off the books has stated in his note that there is no evidence at all of dishonesty in the matter. It is a case of negligence and incompetence. Shri Das was not appointed by this College. He was thrust on us by the Home(Transfer) Department after the partition. He was presently found utterly unfit for the post and we had to write repeatedly for five years. It is no use asking him to pay the price of the books lost. He is a man of humble means and it is beyond his capacity to pay the amount involved. The fact that the salary has been withheld so long is considered a sufficient punishment for his negligence and incompetence.

In view of the above facts the President and members of the Governing Body are requested to be good enough to express their views, in the accompanying sheets, as to the writing off of the books.

A note for circulation to the members of the Governing Body. Presidency College for favour of approval.

Enclosed please find a copy of a letter from the Director of Public Instruction, West Bengal (No.3206A dated the 6th May, 1955) which will speak for itself.

Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose, Steward, Eden Hindu Hostel who was once in Government service and was dismissed from that service and was disqualified from all future employments under the Government did not disclose this fact at the time of applying for the post of Steward, Eden Hindu Hostel. Proceedings have been drawn against him for suppression of material facts in his application for the said post. Findings of the officer conducting the enquiry together with the relevant papers were placed before the Governing Body at their meeting held on 19th March, 1955. Shri Bose admitted that he had suppressed the fact of his dismissal from Government service but this he had done owing to his dire need for service for supporting his dependant family. The Governing Body ~~had~~ adopted the following resolution:-

"That on consideration of the statement made by Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose. the report of the Superintendent, Eden Hindu Hostel and the findings of the officer who held the enquiry, the Governing Body is of opinion that a lenient view may be taken of the offence and that Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose be punished by reduction of his pay viz. from Rs.112/- to Rs.90/- in the scale of Rs.90-4-130/- as recommended by the Enquiry Officer. But the Governing Body is not sure whether he can continue in Government service unless the orders disqualifying Shri Bose from any ~~any~~ employment under the Government is withdrawn and suggests that Government may be pleased to consider the withdrawal of the order".

The above decision was communicated to the Director of Public Instruction, West Bengal, who, in his letter No.3206A dated the 6th May, 1955 (cited above and a copy of which is enclosed herewith) states that Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose, who was dismissed from service and was debarred from future employment under Government by an officer belonging to Government of India cannot be retained in service as the said order is absolute and the State Government cannot modify it and requests that the Governing Body be moved to take appropriate action in the matter. It has been ascertained after enquiry from Shri Bose that he made an appeal against the order of dismissal but received an unfavourable reply.

In view of the above facts, the only course left open is to dismiss Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose from service and it is requested that the Governing Body may approve that Shri Bose may be dismissed without delay.

A note for approval of the Governing Body, Presidency College, for favour of approval.

A note was circulated with this office No.4781(9) dated the 11th August, 1955 regarding dismissal of Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose, Steward, Eden Hindu Hostel, and all the members of the Governing Body agreed that Shri Bose should be dismissed from service as he was one in Government service, was dismissed from that service and was disqualified from all future employments under the Government but suppressed this material fact at the time of applying for the post of Steward, Eden Hindu Hostel.

There is a rule that the accused should be given a further opportunity showing cause against the particular penalty proposed to be inflicted when such penalty is dismissal. removal or reduction in rank. Shri Bose was accordingly asked to show cause why he should not be dismissed and he has sent a reply (copy enclosed) wherein he has raised many irrelevant points. The reasons adduced by him that he cannot be dismissed are all baseless. Under orders of the Government he is debarred from all future employments and he cannot be retained in service as will be evident from the report of the Director of Public Instruction, West Bengal to the following effect made in his letter No.3206A dated the 6th May, 1955 a copy of which was already forwarded to the Governing Body with this office No.4781(9) dated 19th August, 1955:-

Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose, who was dismissed from service and was debarred from future employment under Government by an officer belonging to the Government of India cannot be retained in service as the said order is absolute and the State Government cannot modify it. The Governing Body was accordingly requested in the said letter to take appropriate action in the matter.

It might be recalled that the Governing Body at a meeting held on 19th March, 1955 suggested that a lenient view might be taken of the offence and Shri Bose might be punished by reduction of his pay from Rs.112/- to Rs.90/- but the Director of Public Instruction, West Bengal could not agree to that and pointed out that the order of dismissal was absolute.

It has also been ascertained from Shri Bose that he made an appeal against the order of dismissal but received an unfavourable reply.

It may be mentioned that through oversight the verification of antecedents of Shri Bose was not done in time but as the grave offence viz. participation in a strike against the Government he was serving was disclosed subsequently there is no ground for his retention in service. I hope you will agree to the following decision of the Governing Body.

The case of Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose was duly reconsidered by the Governing Body but as they were fully justified in awarding the punishment of dismissal they stick to their previous decision that Shri Bose should be dismissed without delay.

Your Confidential Letter No. 5264 of September 5, 1955, has been duly received. In reply I wish to state the following:-

- (a) The alleged dismissal order received from the Controller of Factory Accounts did not contain any item whereby I was barred from being appointed in any Government service.
- (b) I replied to an advertisement for the present post and there was no instruction or any obligation to mention the past services nor was it necessary for me to refer to the same.
- (c) It is the usual custom of the Government to verify the antecedents of persons it employs and I am quite sure the same was done in my case also and no objection was raised at the time I was appointed or when I was confirmed after a period of two years of service.
- (d) There is no existing Government Rule whereby a person dismissed from service is debarred from fresh appointment.
- (e) Even under the Constitution of India there is no such provision whereby you can take such high-handed action against a Government servant who had been duly appointed and subsequently made permanent.

The above, I hope, is enough to satisfy you that you cannot in any event dismiss me for an alleged action which was taken against me during my previous service according to the Law of the country and/or under the Trade Unions Act and/or under the Article 19 of the said Constitution and which action and/or its consequences were wholly unconnected with my present post.

I hope, you will kindly reconsider your decision in light of the above submissions.

Ordered : In view of the above-mentioned letter intimating that the Governing Body be requested to ~~reconsider~~ reconsider the orders regarding dismissal of Shri Bhabendra Narayan Bose, Steward, Eden Hindu Hostel, the Governing Body, in view of the quality of his work, decided that he was to be retained in service. The Governing Body's previous resolution dated 14.9.55 was not to be given effect to.

4. Regarding reservation of seats for Scheduled Caste students in general hostels, the Governing Body was of opinion that there should be no reservation of seats.

5. The case of Shri J.C.Naha, Cashier, Presidency College under suspension.

Naha, Cashier, Presidency College (under suspension) as to why the punishment of dismissal should not be ~~conferred~~ <sup>inflicted</sup> upon him, and decided to defer their final orders in this connection, until after the conclusion of the other proceedings pending against him. The Governing Body ordered that, in the meanwhile, Shri Naha should continue under suspension.

3. The Governing Body appointed Dr. P.N. Bhaduri, Head of the Department of Botany, Presidency College to be the Enquiry Officer to enquire into a second series of charges of misappropriation which have been framed against Shri J.C. 4. The Secretary informed the meeting that no successor to the Cashier could be found, since the cash security ~~demanded~~ was totally out of proportion to the poor pay carried by the post. Moreover, the Professors of the college had, of necessity, to help with the cash transactions, to the obvious detriment of their normal teaching work. He also informed the Governing Body of other serious irregularities open to audit ~~the~~ objection caused by the absence of a Cashier. A Cashier, it was pointed out, was essential; otherwise all cash transactions of the college ought to be closed.

The Governing Body is of opinion that this state of things should not be allowed to continue, and agree that there is no likelihood of any suitable man being found for the Cashier's post on the present pay and prospects of that post.

Resolved that Government be requested to take immediate action in the matter, either by nominating, a suitable candidate as Cashier, and/or by passing orders for increasing the pay of the Cashier's post; or by allowing a reduction of the cash security required, and a corresponding increase of the amount of the fidelity bond; or by such other directions as Government may think fit.

The Governing Body is afraid that unless immediate action is taken by appointing a Cashier, no other alternative may remain than to close the college. 801

5. After some discussion it was resolved that Government be asked to sanction the cost of, and allit necessary funds for, insurance against theft of money in transit between the College and the Reserve or the State Bank and vice versa.

That a copy of the enquiry officer's report should be sent to Shri Naha and that he be asked to show cause, on or before Friday the 10th May, 1957 why he should not be removed from his office as Cashier.

5. The financial position of the Eden Hindu Hostel was considered in detail.

Resolved

That the Principal should take up the matter with Government so as to secure suitable grants to effect the rehabilitation of the Eden Hindu Hostel finances.

The Governing Body was not in favour of increasing the seat rent.

6. Re: leave of Dr. S. S. Bhattacharyya.

**Resolved**

That the leave of Dr. Shyama Sankar Bhattacharyya, Lecturer in Botany, Presidency College for the period from the 8th October, 1954 to 22nd December, 1954 be sanctioned as follows:-

7. The Bursar pointed out the difficulties arising from delay in awarding stipends and scholarships.

8. The Bursar explained the nature and amount of Cash transactions of the college office and suggested that the appointment of an Assistant Cashier, with Cash Security, to handle money, was necessary.

The meeting discussed the feasibility of requesting that a competent Specialist Officer of the Government Finance Department be deputed to see whether the appointment of an additional Cashier was justified. It was felt, however, that such a procedure, while useful, would involve a considerable waste of time. In the circumstances, the following resolution was passed:

**Resolved.**

That in view of the heavy cash transactions which make it practically impossible for one Cashier to devote adequate time and attention to his duties, Government be requested to sanction the creation of the post of Assistant Cashier.

9. The Secretary apprised the Governing Body of the present position with regard to the building project.

10. In view of the fact that water coolers have been provided in the College buildings, the Governing Body agree that the two water-Bearers' service should be dispensed with, as being redundant.

11. The Secretary drew the attention of the meeting to the fact that steps to ensure the safety of money in transit between the College and the Bank should be taken as required under rule S.R.31(viii) of the West Bengal Treasury Rules Vol. 1. Cash in transit between college and Bank and vice versa is on most working days of the month, more than Rs. 1000/-.

1. Shri Mujibar Rahman, Assistant Librarian, Presidency College is due to retire from the service of Government with effect from the 15th December, 1957. His retention in service for at least another year is particularly needed in view of a highly important work he has been doing for some time past viz. preparation of press-copies (with up-to-date corrections and additions) of subject-catalogues of his section of the Library, which had not been reprinted for nearly 25 years.

Resolved

"With reference to the impending retirement on December 15, 1957 of Shri Mujibar Rahman, Assistant Librarian, Arts Library, Presidency College, an officer of outstanding abilities and experience, the Governing Body of the College is of the opinion that the interests of the college Library call for the ~~expression~~ retention of his services for some time yet, and recommends extension of service for at least a year with effect from December 15, 1957".

2. It may be mentioned in this connection, that a number of persons who previously officiated in the post now being held by Shri Mitra were found unsuitable and he was found the best candidate when appointed as Store-keeper.



Proceedings of the meeting of the Governing Body, Presidency College held on the 8th April, 1960.

A meeting of the Governing Body was held on 8.4.60 in the Principal's Room at 4.30 P.M.

Members present:

1. The Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.N.Ray, President (in the chair).
2. Dr. A. Tripathi, Member.
3. Shri Arun Kumar Roy, Member.
4. Shri J.N.Rudra, Bursar, Member.
5. Dr. S.K.Basu, Secretary.

1. The proceedings of the last meeting held on 19th Sept. 1957 were confirmed.

As regards points arising out of the proceedings of the last meeting, it was resolved that, as no action had been taken so far regarding item No.3 of the proceeding referred to above, on increase of "other charges of the Eden Hindu Hostel", effect should be given from 1st June, 1960 to the following resolution as passed in the meeting of the Governing Body on 19.9.57:

"that the admission fee to the Eden Hindu Hostel be increased from Rs.4/- to Rs.10/- with effect from the next session i.e. from June, 1958".

It was further resolved that the Superintendent be requested to submit in a tabular form the income and expenditure for the last five years and the probable heads of expenditures liable to arise in the next five years, so that the Government may be moved to pay the whole deficit.

2. The list of holidays for 1960 was approved.

3. A copy of the report by the Inspector of Colleges, Calcutta University, on inspection of this college on 11.9.57 and 12.9.57 was placed before the meeting for discussion of some of the important points, and the following observations were made:

(i) Regarding teaching of Pali in the Sanskrit College:

It was the University which gave affiliation to the Presidency College for Pali though teaching was to be arranged at the Sanskrit College, according to the co-ordination system. This defect has recently been removed by Government.

(ii) Regarding margin of time between classes at the Presidency College and those at the Sanskrit College:

According to the present system there is a margin of 5 minutes between two classes. As such, the distance ~~is~~ between the two colleges being very short, the students should not have any difficulty. Ten minutes interval as suggested, is not possible.

(iii) Regarding the formation of a Teachers' Council in the Presidency College:

Here the Principal runs the administration in consultation with the different heads of departments who are high officers and unlike other colleges in general, the Head of a department always runs his department in consultation with other officers of his department. As such, the Heads of departments are the real representatives of their individual departments and the Principal discusses all important matters with them. The need for a Teachers' Council has never been felt.

contd.....

(iv) Regarding the appointment of a Lady teacher.

The defect has already been removed.

(v) Regarding the appointment of a whole-time Hindi

As the present arrangement of a part-time Lecturer in Hindi is very unsatisfactory, the Governing Body feels the immediate necessity for the appointment of a whole-time Hindi Teacher in the best interest of the students offering Hindi as a language, as the number of such students is definitely increasing and there are quite a number of good students amongst them.

(vi) Regarding the increase in the number of tutorial

In view of the difficulty of accommodation, this was not possible.

4. The appointment of Shri B. Guha as Assistant Librarian, Presidency College, Calcutta, in the scale of Rs.55-130/- with effect from 15.9.59 against the advertised post of the Assistant Librarian is approved.

Writing off of the values of worn out and unserviceable Library books and Periodicals of the Chemistry department, of the total value of Rs.182.25 nP. as given below, was sanctioned:

i) Journal of the Indian Chemical Society, Vol. 2 -- Rs. 20.00  
ii) Journal of the Indian Chemical Society, Vols. 131 (Part 1), & 132 (Part 1) -- Rs.162.25 nP.  
Rs.182.25 nP.

However, it was remarked in this connection, that the books and periodicals in question should be replaced as far as possible.

6. Regarding the increase of emoluments of cooks, etc., of the Eden Hindu Hostel, the Governing Body approved the levy of Rs.32/- per month on the total monthly messing expenditure during the session excluding vacation months, so that the emoluments of each person may increase by Rs.2/- per month. This should be effective from the beginning of the next session and continue as a temporary measure until further orders.

Minutes of the Governing Body meeting in circulation dated 3.11.59 and 21.11.59 were confirmed.

8. In view of the heavy pressure of work on the Cashier because of handling of non-Government funds, the present allowance of Rs.7/- per month for the work being extremely insufficient, the Governing Body resolved that the Cashier should be paid an allowance of Rs.30/- per month with retrospective effect from January, 1960.

This allowance will have to be disbursed from the contribution of subscription from the students.

A note for circulation to the members of the Governing Body

Presidency College for favour of approval :

Item No. 1.

Shri Kashetradhan Bhattacharyya was appointed to act in the post of Instrument Keeper in the scale of Rs. 125-200/- in the Dep't. of Physics, Presidency College, with effect from September, 2, 1967 and in consideration of his sincere and meritorious service he has been serving in this College subsequently been promoted to act in the post of Junior Demonstrator of Physics with effect from November, 9, 1968 but he has not been substantively appointed in any of the posts, he has been serving in this College to the entire satisfaction of his superiors, and as such it is desirable that he should be confirmed in his former post of Instrument Keeper against the permanent post of the same, he hold at the time of appointment on July, 2, 1959.

Shri Bhattacharyya is a Science Graduate with Distinction and was found manifestly superior to all other candidates and he was made himself almost indispensable for the Department of Physics in this College.

The question of parting Shri Bhattacharyya on a permanent basis was, it appears taken up previously but although copy of draft advertisement was sent to the education Directorate under T. O. No. 5667 dated 7/12/60 for approval of the same nothing could be done as no such approval has reached this office.

As Shri Bhattacharyya is now due to retire on October, 1, it is now high time to get him confirmed in his former post as it will be unfair if he does not get the benefit of the service rendered so satisfactorily. That is to say, he should be put on permanent basis with effect from July, 2, 1959, the date of his joining the post of Instrument Keeper in this College. The appointing authority is the Governing Body of the College.

Shri Bhattacharyya was 47 years old when he was first appointed to his post. The minimum age according to rules when he was first appointed to his post. The minimum age according to rules was 35 years and this condition should be relaxed by the Director of Technical Instruction, West Bengal.


Shri Bhattacharyya was recognized at a time when it would have been impossible to get such a qualified candidate and he has done his work faithfully and satisfactorily, sometimes doing the work of three laboratories (I.
