I have the honour to invite your attention to previous correspondence on the subject of the submission of quarterly reports on the state of unrest in Colleges, Schools and Madrasahs and its effect on discipline, and to say that in view of the altered situation in Educational Institutions in Bengal Government no longer consider the submission of such reports necessary. They have accordingly decided that the reports should be discontinued with effect from the beginning of the year 1931.

2. I have, however to add that in the event of the attendance on any day falling below 66% of the roll number (owing to hartal or any other political disturbance) the matter should be reported to this office immediately with necessary explanation.
