AJMER.**

Information for Candidates.

1. A candidate must be in sound bodily health and, if selected, will be required before appointment to satisfy a Medical Board appointed by the Government of India.

2. A candidate must, if required, attend at such place as may be appointed for personal interview.*

3. A candidate must deposit a fee of Rs. 5 under the account Head "XXVI—Miscellaneous Departments—Miscellaneous—Examination Fees" into a Government Treasury and forward the treasury receipt to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, with his application. No claim for the refund of this fee will be entertained.

4. A candidate must send copies of three, and not more than three, testimonials from persons intimately acquainted with his work and character and must also give the names and addresses of three persons to whom reference can be made.

5. The post is included in Class I of the Central Services, but is outside the cadre of the regular educational services.

6. The terms to be offered are as follows :—

(i) The appointment will be made temporarily for two years on a scale of pay of Rs. 600—40—1,000 per mensem and the selected candidate will be on probation for the first year of his service.

(ii) If, on the expiry of two years, he is appointed permanently to the post, he will be entitled to such revised scale of pay as may be attached to the post at that time.

(iii) If the selected candidate is already in Government service, he will retain his existing privileges in respect of leave, pension, etc.

(iv) If he is not already in Government service—

(1) he will be appointed on contract ;

(2) his initial pay will be regulated according to his merits, but a higher starting salary than the minimum will not be given unless it is justified by the special circumstances of the case ;

(3) he will be eligible to subscribe to the General Provident Fund, but if his services are retained for a period of five years or more he will be admitted to the Contributory Provident Fund (India) with retrospective effect from the date of his first appointment and any subscriptions to the General Provident Fund will be treated as subscriptions to the Contributory Provident Fund (India) ;

(4) the contract will be terminable by either party on giving three months' notice ; and



I have the honour to state that Maulvi Ghulam Mustafa, an Assistant Master of this school, who is openly questioning my authority in matters of administration, for which I am responsible, has become a most undesirable element in the school.

He is criticising the punishment that I awarded to Haridas Auddy (vide my Confidential D.O. No. 198 of the 31st August, 1931) and is working up the Muhammadan students against me, thus interfering with the smooth and harmonious working of the school. Not content with this, he has actually proceeded to inspire an anonymous letter addressed to the Director of Public Instruction, Bengal, (vide my Confidential D.O. No. 201 of the 1st September last) containing baseless and malicious ^{us} allegation against me, and also certain imaginary grievances of the Muhammadan teachers of the school.

I am in possession of facts (details of which have been shown to you) that will prove that this letter was typed at a certain house in Mussalmanpara Lane.

MEMORANDUM

I am clearly of opinion that the further stay of this teacher in this school is prejudicial to the interest and discipline of the school. I, therefore, suggest that Maulvi Gholam Mustafa may be immediately transferred to some other school outside Calcutta.

Dear Sir,

On the 21st instant, Maulvi Gholam Mustafa, B.A., B.T. an Assistant Master of this school, who is in charge of the School magazine, made a written complaint to me, saying that Haridas Auddy, a student of Class X of this school, used the term ~~NG~~ against him while criticising him for printing mistakes in the magazine. This information was supplied to the teacher by a Mohamedan student of the same class who overheard the boy using this term.

I at once made a thorough enquiry into the matter and found that ~~the~~ offending student had made a clean confession of his guilt in writing to the teacher on the previous day and had tendered a written apology to him. This document has also been submitted to me by the teacher.

Although the boy was found repentant, as evinced by his clean confession and written apology, it was thought necessary that some adequate disciplinary action should be taken against him. Accordingly he was given four strokes of the cane in the presence of all the members of his class.

I regret to notice now that the action taken by me is being adversely criticised by the teacher and I have reasons to believe that he is so working up the Mohamedan students as may have serious consequences affecting the discipline and harmony of the school.

I would not have, in the ordinary circumstances, reported the matter to you, had there been no apprehension of ugly developments in this connection in future.





My dear Wolfenden,

In my No. 3221 of 23.12.29 I stated that I was not aware of any public grounds which would justify the retention in service beyond the age of 55 of Babu Brahma Kisore Mukerjee, Head Master of the Hindu School. Since then I have had a visit from Dr. A. N. Mukerjee of the Sanskrit College on the subject. He expressed the highest possible opinion of Brahma Kisore Babu, and said that in his view his influence was such that his retention at a time of some difficulty was very desirable.

I explained that I had already written to you as above; and that I had not myself known enough of the Head Master's work to form any very decided opinion about it. But I said that Dr. Mukerjee's opinion deserved full consideration, and that if he would put it on paper I should be glad to forward it to ^{you}. 

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter No. 477A dated the 26th January 1931 regarding the extension of service to Babu Brahma Kissor Mukherji, Head Master of the Hindu School.

2. I submit that there exist public reasons for retaining the services of Babu Brahma Kissor Mukherji. The excitement among students of schools and colleges recently caused by political agitation has subsided, but it will possibly break out again when the members of the Round Table Conference return to India. As a safeguard against the possibility of a renewal of such troubles, it is desirable that experienced and efficient officers, who, by the strength of their character and scholarship have won the confidence and affection of their pupils, should be in charge of educational institutions. If the head of a school is a person who commands the affection and respect of his pupils,

pupils, the work of the institution can be expected to go on without a hitch and without resort to abnormal departmental action. I am, therefore, desirous that Babu Brahma Kisor Mukherji should be given an extension for a further period as Head Master of the Hindu School.

Might I address you on the subject
of the continued extension of service of Babu Brahma Kissore
Mukherjee, Head Master, Hindu School, about which I spoke to
you sometime ago in the Senate House?

(The excitement among students of schools
and colleges recently caused by political agitation has sub-
sided, but it will possibly break out again when the members
of the Round Table Conference return to India. As a safe-
guard against the possibility of a renewal of such troubles,
it is desirable that experienced and efficient officers, who
by the strength of their character and scholarship have won
the confidence and affection of their pupils, should be in
charge of educational institutions.) I am indirectly but
vitally concerned with the Hindu School which shares with
the Sanskrit College and the Collegiate School a Common
Entrance. Any trouble that originates in the Hindu School
will inevitably extend to the institutions under my charge.
If the Head of the School is a person who commands the
deepest veneration and the warmest affection of his pupils,
the work of the school can be confidently expected to go on
without any hitch, and departmental rules and threats whose
application always leads to future complications become super-
fluous. Babu Brahma Kissore

is a person of this type. I am therefore anxious that Babu Brahma Kissore Mukherjee should continue for a further period as Head Master of the Hindu School. He served under me for a ^{couple} of years as Head Master of the Sanskrit Collegiate School and won my complete confidence. He is a man who is absolutely dependable. In this connexion I would draw your attention to a letter (copy enclosed for ready reference) which I addressed to your predecessor. The reasons set forth in the letter were considered to Mr. Barrow to be satisfactory and he moved the Director of Public Instruction for the retention of his services for one year. These reasons still continue to apply.

Dear Mr. Barrow,

Might I take the liberty of addressing you on a subject which is officially outside my province ? The subject is the impending retirement of Babu Brahma Kissore Mukherjee, Head Master, Hindu School. Brahma Kissore Babu served under me as Head Master of the Sanskrit Collegiate School for about two years, and I greatly appreciated his services to the School. During his management the number of pupils increased from 170 to 220, and the results of the Matriculation Examination were most satisfactory, the percentage of passes being over 90. The annual report of the School evoked the following words of praise from Mr. Oaten who presided at the Prize Distribution of 1926 "However high the University Standard may be raised, the boys of this School will never squirm". This is all the more creditable, as the school can devote no more than $\frac{3}{5}$ ths of the time available to University Courses, $\frac{2}{5}$ the being devoted to Sanskrit Courses which are a special feature of this School and compulsory for all pupils. The special Sanskrit Courses taught in the School reach up to the B.A. Honours Standard, but receive no recognition from the University. These Sanskrit Courses are a great handicap, but in spite of this dead weight, Brahma Kissore Babu was able to achieve excellent results. Nearly all the boys in the top class were sent up, so that ~~there~~ was practically no wastage.

Another thing which I noticed was the deep reverence which he succeeded in evoking in his pupils. Men with such dignity of character and such sincere affection for their pupils are rather rare in the teaching profession. He had such a firm hold on the affection of his pupils that I felt that the School was perfectly safe from the influence of outside agitations, so long as Brahma Kissore Babu continued to be its Head. The Hindu School is one of the most important institutions in the province, and in view of possible trouble in the near future.

future, I am of opinion that, in the interests of the public he should be granted an extension of service for a year. I can assure you that many guardians of the boys of the Hindu School are anxious that Brahma Kissore Babu should continue to be the Head of the Hindu School during the period of trouble which they apprehend.

My opinion of Brahma Kissore Babu and his work as stated in this letter would be fully borne out by my annual confidential reports.

As he is no longer connected with the Sanskrit College, I cannot officially write to the Director. I should therefore feel deeply grateful to you if you would kindly place my views before him with such observations as you may be pleased to make.
