


My dear Khan Bahadur,

I have sent a formal proposal regarding the teaching of Bengali and Urdu up to the Hons. standard in my College and sent it as directed to Mr. Zachariah first. I am however enclosing a copy of it for your perusal. Mr. Zachariah told me that he is going to send it down to you for quick action as there is very little time to be lost.

I have suggested that Dr. Sadananda Bhaduri should be promoted to the B.S.E.S. and Babu Janardan Chakravarti to be the Professor of Bengali against the post of the Professor of Bengali, the creation of which I have suggested against the post that will be vacated if Dr. Sadananda Bhaduri is promoted to the B.S.E.S.

I understand that the Professorship in Sanskrit is soon falling vacant at Rajshahi and I would ^{have} prefered at Dr. J. B. Chaudhuri should be transferred against that vacancy and the resulting vacancy should be filled by the promotion of Babu Gourinath Shastri who is undoubtedly one of the most brilliant men we have but the D.P.I. does not relish the idea of Dr. Chaudhuri's transfer, I think on extra academical grounds. However I rely on you to see that justice is done to Gouri Babu.

I h. h. to refer to your letter No. 38404, dated 18. 10. 44 communicating Govt. Orders granting an extension of service to Prof. S. P. Bhattacharyya upto 15th Jany. 1945. and to submit the following arrangements for the work of the department after his retirement.

I have already discussed with you the desirability of discontinuing the teaching of Hons. Sanskrit in this College as the numbers offering this subject do not seem to justify ~~the teaching of the subject~~ ^{the practice for} in my college especially as adequate facilities for teaching of the subject exist in the city at Sanskrit College. If any students still wish to offer Hons. in Sanskrit arrangements may be made with your permission and with the permission of the University for his attending ~~Hons.~~ ^{his} class in the Sanskrit College. I also suggested to you at the time that we should provide for the teaching of Bengali as a language up to the Hons. standard in the College. As I have already discussed this fully, I need not dilate again on the desirability of teaching this subject in the premier college of the province, ^{especially as} At present specially Bengali up to the Hons.

Hon. Sans. Dept.

standard is taught only in one Govt. College, viz. Krishnagar College. The ~~expenditure~~ acceptance of the proposal which I am submitting would involve Government in no additional financial commitments except for a non-recurrent grant for the purchase of ~~mf~~ books.

At present the College teaches up to the Hons. standard in Sanskrit and Pali and provides teaching in Bengali and Hindi as Vernaculars. The staff sanctioned for the Dept. of Sans and Pali and Bengali are :-

1 B.S.E.S. Prof. of Sanskrit

1 B.E.S. Prof. of Sans.

1 S.E.S. Lecturer of Sans.

1 B.E.S. Prof. of Pali

1 S.E.S. Lecturer of Bengali

1 part-time Lecturer of Hindi.

I suggest that the Department should be called the Department of Sanskritic studies and that the B.S.E.S. post should be filled by an officer who has both Sanskrit and Pali qualifications and who is also competent to take part in Bengali teaching.

I would suggest that Dr. Sadananda Bhaduri who is at present the Prof. of Sanskrit and Pali in this College should be appointed on promotion to be the Head of the Dept. of Sanskratic studies in the B.S.E.S. Dr. Bhaduri stood First in the First Class in Sanskrit in 1922, standing

First in the combined result of all the Groups in Sanskrit. In 1927 he stood first in the First Class in the M.A. Examination in Pali. In 1942 he obtained his Ph.D. Degree. He had earlier topped the Hons. list in Sanskrit, standing First in the First Class in 1920. He is an excellent teacher and he has been teaching also in the Bengali Department. I suggest that ~~as~~ against the B.E.S. Professor in Sans. a B.E.S. Prof. in Bengali be created.

~~I understand that a B.E.S. vacancy in Sanskrit is shortly going to occur at Rajshahi as Prof. Dhiresh Ch. Acharyya Shastri is due to retire on superannuation. Dr. Jitendra Bimal Chaudhuri who was appointed to the B.E.S. in 11.8.42 as Prof. of Sanskrit may be transferred to Rajshahi College and the resulting vacancy filled by the promotion of Babu Janardan Chakravarti, M.A., First in Class I Indian Vernacular, ^{other lecturer in Bengali} who is perhaps the best teacher of Bengali at present in the province, be promoted to the post. The resulting vacancy in the post of the Lecturer in Bengali may be filled by the re-transfer of Babu Sasanka Sekhar Bagchi who has~~

lately been transferred to Hooghly. If my proposal meets with your approval I would request you to authorize me to apply to the University for affiliation in Bengali up to the Hons. standard.

I have also to suggest that my College should be affiliated to teach Urdu up to the Hons. standard. At present this subject is not taught in any Govt. or non-Govt. College and there is no demand for the study of this subject. ~~I further propose that the discontinuance~~ ^{some} ~~of the Dept. of Arabic, Persian and Urdu~~ consists at present of one B.S.E.S. Prof., 2 B.E.S. Profs. and 2 S.E.S. Lecturers. Khan Sahib Mafizul Haq, the present Head of the Dept. is a brilliant scholar whose mother tongue is Urdu and he is fully competent to teach Urdu up to the Hons. standard. I would suggest in the interest of the Dept. that one of the B.E.S. ~~professorships~~ ^{posts} in Arabic and Persian should be called designated with the Professor of Urdu and one B.E.S. professorship should be transferred to the Islamia College and Prof. Taher ~~Reziz~~ Rezvi who was formerly a Lecturer in Urdu in this College be posted here as the Professor of Urdu. If my proposal meets with your approval I would request you to authorize me to apply to the University for affiliation of my College up to the Hons. B.A. standard in Urdu.

My dear Zachariah,

You may remember that Mahalanobis and I had a talk with you about Dr. Kar. I also mentioned about him in my Confidential letter No. 3215, dated the 16th September, 1944, while forwarding the confidential reports on the officers posted to this. Dr. Kar is proving very difficult. He is creating difficulties in about doing invigilation work and/Various other ways we are not getting as much out of him as we have a right to expect. He seems pre-occupied with his "researches" which I am told are leading him to a cul-de-sac. It would be most helpful for the College if orders for transferring him with effect from the next session could be issued. I personally like to have somebody, either from Noorul Islam or Rajshahi, who can do work properly here.




