Sir,

I have the honour to report that Dr. Anukul Chandra Sircar reached his second efficiency bar on 16th August 1936, but that owing to his ignorance of the provisions of Circular No. 20 dated the 23rd October 1936, did not apply in proper time.

Dr. Sircar has acquired a wide reputation as a chemist and was elected President of the Chemistry Section of the Indian Science Congress, 1935, a very high honour for a Professor. He has published numerous papers on Organic Chemistry and is the Editor of the Journal of the Indian Chemical Society. It cannot be expected that a man of such intensive research and other activities should be a conspicuous figure in the social and extra-academic life of the College, but I can say that Dr. Sircar is popular with his students. His work moreover is not marred by tactlessness, supersensitive temperament, want or excess of zeal.

I have therefore to recommend that he may be allowed to cross the second efficiency bar.
