I have the honour to invite a reference to Government order No. 472-T/Edn., dated the 4th June 1931, (a copy of which was forwarded to you with this office endorsement No. 4542-A., of the 15th idem), sanctioning the appointment of Mr. Upendra Nath Ghoshal to act as Lecturer in Economics, Presidency College, in the temporary Bengal Educational Service post created in that order.
