

My dear Stapleton,

With regard to my suggestion about the Pujah Holidays, I consulted some members of the staff this morning and in their opinion Wolfenden's objection deserves ~~little or~~ no consideration. The only important pujahs later in the month, supposing we reopen on the 9th of October, are the 21st, 22nd and 23rd, Kali Pujah and Bhatriidwitya. The general opinion of the professors is that students like being in Calcutta and would neither stay away in their homes till these pujahs were over, nor leave Calcutta on account of these.
