Dear Sir,

I am desired to address you on the subject of the present situation in the country as affecting the educational institutions. The matter was discussed by the Vice-Chancellor and Syndicate at a conference with the Principals of Colleges in Calcutta and the suburbs, called for the purpose on the 16th January 1932. The decisions arrived at at the conference were placed before the Vice-Chancellor and Syndicate and they have directed me to forward to you the following resolutions passed by them in the matter for your information and guidance:-

(1) Each teacher should hold his class at the appointed time even if one student is present.

(2) If no student is present in the class at the specified time, the teacher will wait for 10 minutes and mark the whole class absent.

(3) The Principal should see that the walls of the buildings and the notice-boards be kept free from unauthorised notices and hand-bills.

(4) Principals are requested to forward to the University the names of students of their own Colleges who have been found interfering with the liberty of other students in attending to their normal duties, together with a report as to the action taken by them in the matter.

A copy of the notice issued to the students of the Post-Graduate Departments in Arts and Science of this University , under orders of the Vice-Chancellor and Syndicate, is enclosed for your information.

## CALCUTTA UNIVERSITY

Copy of Notice issued to students of the Post-Graduate  
Departments in Arts and Science

" It may be within the recollection of our students that certain unfortunate incidents took place inside the University Buildings in September, 1930. In order to prevent the recurrence of such incidents in future, it was agreed between the University and the Government of Bengal that the police will not take action themselves within the University premises without first reporting their complaint to the University authorities and giving them a reasonable opportunity to take steps to remove all legitimate cause of complaint, the University authorities in their turn gave assurance to the Government that they will directly or indirectly give no cause for such police interference. It is, therefore, requested that all teachers and students should co-operate with the University authorities in avoiding any possible breach of such agreement. No demonstration or meetings should therefore be held within the University Buildings or Compound which may result in a breach of this arrangement".
