Extracts from page 250 of the Rules and Orders of the Education Department, Bengal, under heading " Affiliation of Technical Schools to High Schools "

++-----++

- (10) The Final examinations of the "B" and "C" Classes are considered by Government to be equivalent to the Entrance Examination. The Calcutta Chamber of Commerce has stated that a student who has passed the examination at the end of the C. Course will be considered for the purposes of employment equal to an Entrance-passed student.
- (13) After passing the examination of the first-class B Course, students can join either the third-year class of an ordinary Technical school or the Second-year class of the Apprentice Department of the Sibpur College ( provided accomodation is available), and, similarly, after passing the examination of the first-class C Course students will be able to join classes designed to fit them for following Commerce, Industries, etc. which classes will be considered equal to the F. A. Classes of the Calcutta University. This course will last for two years, and an examination will be held at the end of it, and the passing of this examination will be held by Government to be equivalent to having passed the F. A. Examination.
