We, the undersigned students of the special class, Presidency College, beg most respectfully to bring to your notice, that on opening of the aforesaid class, we had been admitted in it on payment of Rs. 10 as admission and Rs. 5 as schooling fees. But subsequently by a notification in the Calcutta Gazette it has been ordered by His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor that the schooling and admission for the special class should respectively be Rs. 3 and Rs. 5 only. We therefore beg most humbly you will be pleased to order a refund of sum of Rs. 7 paid in excess by each of us.

We further beg leave to state that we had applied to Mr. Sutcliffe on the subject, but he refused to forward our application to you.

With reference to the letter from the students of the special class, forwarded under your endorsement No. 3307 of 21st instant, I have the honor to report that the fees for admission and tuition were altered from Rs. 10 and Rs. 5 respectively to Rs. 5 and Rs. 3 from the date of the Notification of the Government of 9th July. The students whose names are attached to the letter were admitted in the month of June upon payment of the scale of fees then in force. It is not usual to give retrospective effect to charges in the scale of fees, and it would obviously be impossible to do so without special orders of Government. I cannot recommend a refund of the fees paid by these young men in June.
