

Sanction to the grant of remuneration to Dr. Partridge for course of lectures in Physiology in the Presidency College  
Edn. Proceedings 32-33, Jan. 1863

From W. S. ATKINSON

ESQ., Director of Public Instruction, - (No. 2249, dated the 29th December 1862)

Forwarded to the Under-Secretary to the Government of Bengal, with a recommendation that His Honor will be pleased to sanction the payment of Rupees 400 to Dr. Partridge from surplus Schooling Fees of the Presidency College. It may be added that the order of the Supreme Government by which the Director is empowered to expend surplus Schooling Fees contains no limitation of the kind suggested by the Civil Pay-Master.

From J. SUTCLIFFE, ESQ., M.A. Principal, Presidency College to W. S. ATKINSON, ESQ., M.A., Director of Public Instruction, - (No. 350, dated the 20th November 1862)

I Have the honor to inform you that in accordance with the permission granted in your note from Darjeeling, I have made an arrangement with Dr Partridge to deliver the usual course of Lectures, and I recommend that Dr Partridge should receive a remuneration of Rupees 400 for his services. This amount might be debited to surplus Schooling Fees, and the delay caused by an application for a Special Grant thereby be avoided. You are aware that some such arrangement was indispensable, owing to the sudden departure of Dr Crozier on sick leave, and the non-appointment of a successor in time to take up the usual course delivered to our final Students,

From W. S. ATKINSON, ESQ., Director of Public Instruction, to J. SUTCLIFFE, ESQ., Principal, Presidency College, - (No. 2685, dated the 21st November 1862)

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No, 350, dated the 20th current, and in reply to sanction as therein recommended, an allowance of Rupees 400 to Dr Partridge as a remuneration for the course of Lectures to be delivered by him to the Students of the B. A. Class, the amount being debited to surplus fees of the College.

Office Memorandum from H SANDEMAN, ESQ., Civil Pay-Master, to the Director of Public Instruction, - (No. 1223, dated the 28th November 1862)

With reference to your No. 2686, dated 21st instant.

As Professors of Schools hold their appointments from Government, it is submitted that any additional allowances granted to them should be sanctioned by the same Authority. I would therefore suggest that the Grant of the remuneration of Rupees 400 to Dr. Partridge may be submitted for the confirmation of Government.
